1. Important Cultural Information

- In Germany, it is not common that one hosts people they don't know. That they do so to give young activists the chance to participate in the conference should never be taken for granted!
- The hosts offer their accommodation for free. It is not a hotel and the hosts are not cleaning staff
- Treat your hosts accordingly and follow their house rules. In Germany, rules and agreements are taken seriously and are not flexible. If you make an appointment with your host, really be on time
- Keep the place clean and tidy
- Communication is key: If you are unsure about the house rules or if your travel plans change, be honest with your hosts and communicate with them clearly
- By valuing your host's hospitality, you ensure a successful BedExchange, which will hopefully ensure that the host will offer their accommodation again in the next year

2. Practical information regarding your host family

- Save you host's contact so you can contact them
- Tell you hosts about your exact arrival time in advance
- When you leave the house, close (and lock) the door behind you
- Respect the quiet hours and be quiet at night
- Do not invite other people to your accommodation unless you have your host's approval
- Do not give the key(s) to anyone else
- If you don't end up staying at the assigned accommodation, but you know someone who is still looking for accommodation, please contact the BedExchange team. They will do their best to reassign the place to your friend. Do not send friends to stay there and do not forward the address to anyone

3. Public Transportation

- Bonn has a good public transport system. It is the best way to get around and to the conference center. We recommend these apps to look for connections:
 - "DB Navigator" for regional and (inter)national trains
 - "SWB easyGO" for transport in Bonn (busses, trams)
 - "Google Maps"
- Tickets: You can buy most tram and bus tickets via the SWB app. This applies to individual as well as day/week tickets.
- "Deutschlandticket" might be the cheapest option for you
 - 49€ per calendar month, valid for all regional transport in Germany
 - !! Not included: high speed trains with names like ICE, IC, EC.
 - In "DB Navigator" you can exclude these trains if you try to find a connection. In order to do so go to "options" → "mode of transport" → select "local/regional transport only"
 - it only exists digital so make a screenshot of the QR Code and it is tight to you as a person (you need your ID to use it)
 - \circ subscription basis so you need to cancel it on time (10th of a month)
 - \circ $\;$ you can buy the ticket via the applications mentioned above. Normally you have to pay with IBAN
 - Payment via Paypal:
 - download App "VRR Bus&Bahn"
 - create an account within the app
 - connect paypal as a method of payment
 - choose "Deutschlandticket"
 - You yourself are responsible for buying your tickets. This is not your host's responsibility!

4. SIM Cards / Internet

- Easiest way to get a SIM card: O2
 - Shop is at "Marktplatz" in the city center; address: Markt 23-27, 53111 Bonn)
 - You need your passport (original, a photo is not enough!) and 25€
 - You can buy the SIM Card and do the registration and legitimation directly in the store \rightarrow SIM Card works immediately afterwards
 - You have 25 GB fast internet for 4 weeks
- They can also be bought at the check-out of most supermarkets like Lidl or Aldi
 - You will need to activate the SIM Card by verifying it with video identification, sometimes a german passport is required (you can ask your hosts)

5. Visa

- We have the support of the city of Bonn for the bedexchange. You are going to get this document for your Visa application
- Ask your hosts about a proof of accommodation. They are going to receive a Visa letter. With this VISA letter, you can proof that you are staying in Bonn with the BedExchange, it is therefore a proof of accomoation

- If there are changes in your stay due to the visa, communicate this with your host and us

6. Other Information

- make sure you have an adapter for German (EU) power sockets
- Tap water is of a very high quality in Germany and perfectly safe to drink. You can refill your bottle at basically any sink. No need to buy bottled water
- For recycling purposes, we have a deposit system on most bottles and cans. Don't

throw bottles with this sign away. You can return them at a machine in the supermarket and get the deposit back

• We also sort our trash so when in doubt about the different bins, ask your host about it

7. First Contact with your Host (E-Mail Template)
